



## Protection of your personal data<sup>1</sup>

As a result of the European Union's General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)<sup>2</sup>, we would like to inform you of how Fedris processes your personal data and of your rights in relation to this data.

### For what purpose do we process your data?

We need your data to perform our legal tasks in relation to occupational risks as part of the social security<sup>3</sup>. For example:

- to follow up on your enquiry and process your dossier
- to inform you of a decision by our institution
- to calculate and pay a compensation you are entitled to
- to refund your health care expenses
- to control insurance companies and employers in relation to occupational risks
- to carry out scientific and statistical studies for preventive purposes

### How long do we keep your data?

Your data will be kept for the period required for the processing purposes mentioned above and/or the period required as legal proof, to a maximum of 30 years after your death.

### To which parties could your data be transmitted?

We may transmit all or part of your data to people and institutions which collaborate with Fedris. This mainly includes the following receivers:

- other public bodies: Federal Public Service Finance, National Social Security Office, Federal Pensions Service, National Institute for the Social Security of the Self-employed..
- banking institutions through which Fedris makes payments to beneficiaries
- your health insurance company or any other institution with a right of subrogation
- your healthcare providers (doctors, prosthetist, etc.)
- doctors and lawyers with whom Fedris collaborates
- your employer's occupational health department
- courts where a legal proceeding is pending
- your employer's insurance company (in the case of an occupational accident)
- your employer or educational establishment

### What are your rights?

1. To ask what data Fedris holds about you
2. To obtain a copy of this information
3. To request the deletion of this information (subject to reservations)
4. To ask for this information to be corrected
5. To find out whether the decisions made by Fedris have been automated or not
6. To withdraw your consent if you have given it
